





Troop 220: Day Hike, Rio Cebolla, Jemez Mountains, Saturday August 31st, 2019

Troop 220 invites Bear and Webelos Cub Scouts (with a parent, siblings are welcome!) to join us for a day hike on the upper Rio Cebolla (Trail 68), above the Seven Springs Fish Hatchery in the Jemez Mountains. This will be a great opportunity to meet our Scouts, to go on a short hike, fish for native Rio Grande cutthroat trout, learn about the managing endangered species and get some Bear and Webelos adventure requirements completed.

When: 7:30 am Saturday, 31 August 2019.

Where: Covenant United Methodist Church, 8510 Wyoming Blvd NE, Albuquerque, 87113 (Corner of Wyoming and Wilshire). Meet at CUMC where we'll consolidate passengers and cars for the drive to the trailhead.

Adventure Requirements: Webelos/AoL Adventures: Walkabout, Into the Wild, Into the Woods, Outdoorsman. Bear Adventure: Fur, Feathers, and Ferns.

Activities and learning: We'll do about a 1.5 mile (one way) hike along the scenic Rio Cebolla, stop for lunch and then spend a couple of hours fishing and exploring along the river. At the trailhead we'll review the rules of safe hiking including the buddy system and at lunch we'll have a discussion, led by a U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service biologist, on native species, the impacts of non-native species introduction, habitat loss and the restoration efforts for the Rio Grande cutthroat trout.

What to wear/bring: Saturday sack lunch/trail snacks, fishing gear, \$5 for incidentals; be prepared for a day hike in northern New Mexico mountains (day pack,10 essentials for hiking, good boots or closed toed shoes, hat, layers, water, sunscreen).
